Dear Mr. Douglass:

On April 15, 2008, you filed on behalf of ISO New England Inc. (ISO-NE) and New England Power Pool Participants Committee (NEPOOL) revised tariff sheets<sup>1</sup> concerning revisions to section 6.4.4 and Appendix F of Market Rule 1. The revised tariff sheets exclude the Real-Time Load Obligations above a certain limit of certain pump storage resources from the calculation of charges to pay for local second contingency protection in the Real-Time Energy Market. The revised tariff sheets are accepted effective July 1, 2008.

The filing was noticed on April 17, 2008, with comments, protests or interventions due on May 6, 2008. No protests or adverse comments were filed.

This action is taken pursuant to the authority delegated to the Director, Division of Tariffs and Market Development - East under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307.
